THE KINGDOM OF BELGIUM, represented by:

**The Federal Government,
The Flemish Government,
The Government of the French Community,
The Walloon Government,
The Government of the Brussels-Capital Region,
The Government of the German-speaking Community,**

and

THE EUROPEAN FREE TRADE ASSOCIATION,

HAVING REGARD TO the Headquarters Agreement between the Kingdom of Belgium and the European Free Trade Association, signed on 27 January 1993,

WANTING TO determine the privileges and immunities necessary for the proper execution of the task of the European Free Trade Association,

HAVE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 1

The first sentence of Article 15 of the Headquarters Agreement of 27 January 1993 is replaced by the following text

“The Head of the EFTA Office in Brussels and his two deputies will enjoy diplomatic privileges and immunities”

ARTICLE 2

Each Party shall notify the other of the completion of its internal constitutional and legislative procedures required for the entry into force of this Protocol.

ARTICLE 3

This Protocol shall enter into force on the thirtieth day following the date on which the last Party to complete the procedure notified the other Party that the internal procedures required for the entry into force of this Protocol have been completed.

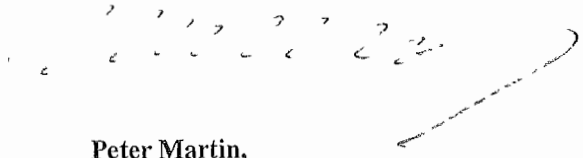

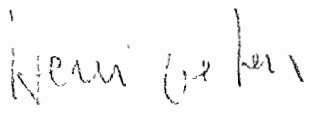
